Driver Education at Burwell Jr. Sr. High School 2012

The Nebraska Safety Center at the University of Nebraska at Kearney will be providing driver education at Burwell Jr. Sr. High School. The cost is \$295.00 per student. Class time will be from 8:30 to 11:30 July 9th - 20th. The students will also travel to Kearney for Range and Simulation on July 12th and 17th from 2:30 - 8:00. The behind the wheel and on street testing will be arranged at the convenience of the students and instructor and will be done in the local area. The student's parents are responsible for transporting and supervising participant to and from the range. The class is limited to a maximum of 24 students. If your enrollment form is received and the class is filled, your deposit will be refunded. Enrollment will be on a first come, first serve basis. Each student must have a school permit, learner's permit for a school permit, learner's permit, or driver license. Enrollment forms are available at the High School office.



IT'S NOT OVER YET FOR SENIORS

Graduation is not the end of things. Some important matters still need to be taken care of before going off to college.

- If you applied to more than one school, remember to let the school(s) you are not attending know that you will not be attending, especially if they have offered you scholarships.
- Register for classes as early as possible. Classes do fill up and you may not be able to get the classes you want or need at the time you want them or with the instructor of your choice.
- 3. If an orientation is offered, take advantage of it. It can help get you off on the right foot during those first days and weeks of school.
- If you have taken any college credit courses in high school, notify the college from where
 you took them to mail an official transcript to the college you will be attending.
 - Remember to mail back housing contracts in a timely manner.
- 6. Check over the financial aid awards. You do not have to accept the entire package. Remember that <u>subsidized</u> loans are the ones for which the interest begins at repayment (six months after you graduate or drop below half-time status), so that is better than an <u>unsubsidized</u> loan for which interest begins immediately. Do NOT borrow more than you really need—a loan must be repaid.
- 7. You may be offered work study, but that doesn't mean you will necessarily get it. Call the financial aid office to learn the procedure for actually acquiring a work study job. Remember, the money you earn from work study must be reported on your FAFSA, but it is subtracted out so it is not really counted as income for you in the financial aid formula. Another plus about work study jobs is that they are usually for the college, so you will have the same vacations as the school.
- 8. Check the details of the scholarships you were awarded. Some may require a thank you or your social security number. Others, such as the Butts Scholarship, may require a copy of grades at the end of each semester before the money will be forwarded to the school.
- 9. Do write thank you notes to persons you used as references, as well as your scholarship donors. It is only common courtesy to show your appreciation for the time, effort, <u>and</u> money they spent in helping finance your education.
- 10. Enjoy your summer, but <u>please</u> be safe and make good choices so you will be able to take the next step on your journey through life.

STATE COLLEGE ADVANTAGE PROGRAM GRANTS TUITION ASSISTANCE

Nebraska students planning to attend a state college (Chadron, Peru, or Wayne) are guaranteed total grant assistance equal to the full cost of tuition. To receive the Nebraska State College System Advantage, a student must be:

- A resident of Nebraska
- A federal Pell Grant recipient
- A new first-time freshman in 2012-13 or sophomores or juniors who were new first-time freshmen attending a state college
- Enrolled in at least 12 on-campus credit hours
- Meet the priority deadline of June 1 (after that time it will depend on funding).
