

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER MR. MAX, PRINCIPAL

One criteria of a student's success in school is regular and punctual attendance. Prompt arrival at school is expected of all students. Late arrivals disrupt class and cause loss of valuable instructional time. Burwell Elementary has made a change to our attendance policy regarding being tardy. Any student who arrives after 8:15 a.m. is considered tardy. Any student arriving after 9:30 a.m. will be counted absent $\frac{1}{2}$ day and any student leaving prior to 1:45pm will be counted absent $\frac{1}{2}$ day. Please contact the school as soon as possible when your child is sick so we can make the necessary arrangements with your teacher. The purpose of this change is to be more consistent with the attendance policy and to stress the importance of getting to school on time. If a student is habitually tardy or absent, parents will be notified and a plan will be made.

ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

The A.H.R.A. (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act) regulations require yearly notification to parents of the presence of asbestos within the district buildings. Asbestos is a mineral fiber associated with lung disease when inhaled. However, asbestos within building materials usually does not pose a health problem when maintained in good condition and not disturbed. Such is the case at Burwell Elementary Schools.

Burwell Jr. Sr. High School and Burwell Elementary has an asbestos management plan on file at the district office located at the Burwell Jr. Sr. High school. All three schools had their inspections completed on October 9, 2006 and everything was found satisfactory. The District's management plan is available for inspection upon request. What is AR?

Accelerated Reader (AR) is a reading management tool within the Renaissance Learning program.

Who sets the goals?

Each quarter individual goals are set for each student by his/ her teacher. Goals are communicated and monitored by various means for each of the classrooms. Ask your student(s) about his/ her goal and progress toward making that goal.

Can I see my student's progress?

Yes – Renaissance Home Connect is available for parents to view reading progress towards goals. Through Home Connect parents can receive automatic updates to specific email addresses.

What do I do if my student needs help with the goal?


Communicate with your student throughout the quarter. Days go by and before we know it the end of the goal period is upon us, and students feel the pressure to reach their goal. Teachers and staff at Burwell Elementary are here to help throughout the quarter. Please contact the school if you have questions. We are there to help students throughout the quarter. We want to encourage continued reading practice on a daily/ weekly basis rather than last minute cramming to complete a goal. Students and parents are welcome to spend time in the library after school to read books and take tests.

Will an unmet AR reading goal affect my child's classroom reading grade?

No. AR goals, points and percentages, will not impact a student's grade in the short-term; however, making time for reading towards a goal will positively impact student's growth as a reader which can help improve grades across subject areas.

What happens if my student does not make his/her goal?

Students with unmet goals will not be able to participate in the AR movie on December 21. The movie is an incentive for students to finish a goal which has been set. We understand many circumstances arise which may interfere with a student's ability to complete his/her goal by the deadline; therefore, an unfinished goal should not be seen as a failure and students will not be punished or disciplined.
