clarify: to make something easier to understand

consult: to seek information or advice

eliminate: to get rid of something completely

Maria wants to eliminate junk food from her diet because it is not healthy.

expand: to become larger

Pumping air into your flat tire will cause it to <u>expand</u>.

glance: to look at or read something quickly

The race car driver took a glance over his shoulder before changing lanes.

inhibit: to make it difficult or impossible for someone to do something

Alyssa's low grade point average will <u>inhibit</u> her from attending the college of her choice.

promote: to help something develop and be successful

A grand opening celebration will help to <u>promote</u> the new hotel.

realize: to know or understand something that you did not know before

Emma did not realize the size of the ocean until she flew over it.

represent: to stand for or symbolize

Two students will <u>represent</u> our school at a national spelling competition.

seize: to take; to grab with force; to control

The dog tried to <u>seize</u> the ball from my hand.

utilize: to use something

A surgeon must <u>utilize</u> sterilized instruments while performing an operation.
