constant: happening all the time

Business at the gas station is <u>constant</u>, so it is open twenty four hours a day.

deliberate: planned and intended

The reporter's questions during the interview were <u>deliberate</u> and direct.

efficient: doing something without wasting time, money, or energy

We do most of our shopping at one store because it is more <u>efficient</u>.

essential: very important and necessary

It is <u>essential</u> to stretch before exercising so you don't get hurt.

fierce: angry, violent, or ready to attack

The bears at the zoo are <u>fierce</u>; do not attempt to feed them.

peculiar: strange and surprising

The activity at the abandoned warehouse was peculiar, so we informed the police.

pleasant: nice or good

It is a <u>pleasant</u> day for swimming, so we will go to the beach.

scarce: not enough of something

You'll want to get to the movie theatre early because parking will be scarce.

significant: important

Sophie's decision to transfer schools will be significant to her education.

substantial: large in amount, number, or size

The winner of the talent contest will receive a <u>substantial</u> amount of money.

temporary: existing or happening for a limited period of time

The cast on Kurt's arm is temporary and will be removed after six weeks.
