#### essential: very important and necessary

#### facilitate: to make it easier for something to happen

The student council will *facilitate* a discussion about school safety at the next assembly.

#### incident: an individual event that can be unpleasant

The judge instructed the witness to share his version of the <u>incident</u> with the court.

#### inhibit: to make it difficult or impossible for someone to do something

Alyssa's low grade point average will inhibit her from attending the college of her choice.

#### initiate: to start something

Suzanne will initiate work on her science project to be sure that it is completed on time.

# obstacle: something that stops you from doing something

Watching television can be an obstacle to getting your homework finished.

#### precise: exact and correct

Matt gave his friends precise directions to the bowling alley.

## restriction: a rule or set of laws that limits what you can do, or what can happen

There is a <u>restriction</u> on cell phones at our school; they can only be used during lunch.

#### substantial: large in amount, number, or size

The winner of the talent contest will receive a <u>substantial</u> amount of money.

#### utilize: to use something

A surgeon must <u>utilize</u> sterilized instruments while performing an operation.
