advocate: a person who publically supports an idea or a cause Kate is an <u>advocate</u> for diabetes research because her friend has the disease.

attribute: a characteristic of a person, thing, or group Charlie's best <u>attribute</u> is his sense of humor; he makes people laugh.

burden: something difficult or worrying that you have to deal with Pet ownership can be a <u>burden</u> if you are away from home often.

debate: a discussion about a subject that involves opposite viewpoints The city council will host a debate to determine the need for a new shopping mall.

desire: a strong feeling of wanting something Hannah's <u>desire</u> for chocolate is so strong; she cannot resist a piece of cake.

dilemma: a situation in which you have to make a difficult choice Choosing between a friend's party and a family vacation is a <u>dilemma</u> for Timothy.

influence: the effect that someone or something has on another Today's cold weather will have an <u>influence</u> on my decision to wear a sweater.

opinion: a person's ideas or beliefs about a particular subject In Mia's <u>opinion</u>, girls should be allowed to participate in football.

option: something you can choose to do or have You have the <u>option</u> of paying for your purchase with either a credit card or cash.

performance: how well a person or thing functions The singer's cold affected his <u>performance</u> of the national anthem.

priority: something given special attention because of its importance The restaurant's <u>priority</u> is to provide good service to its customers.

resource: something that people can use to do other things Emily had difficulty finding an accurate <u>resource</u> for her history paper.
