advantage: something that helps you to be successful

A babysitter with experience has an <u>advantage</u> over someone without it.

debt: something owed to someone else John owes his parents a huge <u>debt</u> because they supported him through college.

error: a **mistake** Nicole noticed a spelling <u>error</u> in her paper and corrected it immediately.

labor: hard work done with a person's hands or body Fixing the broken fence took a great amount of <u>labor</u>.

minimum: the smallest number or amount possible You must be a <u>minimum</u> of forty-eight inches tall to ride the roller coaster.

motive: a reason for doing something Alex's <u>motive</u> for studying was to pass his driver's exam.

portion: a part of something If you are not hungry, you can ask for a smaller <u>portion</u>.

product: something made by nature, human industry, or art It is helpful to read reviews before buying a new <u>product</u>.

salary: money paid to a worker Sarah's new job has a high <u>salary</u> but will require her to move.

supplement: something added to something else in order to improve it Learning new words will help to <u>supplement</u> your vocabulary.

symptom: a sign that a serious problem may exist Difficulty breathing is one <u>symptom</u> of an asthma attack.

welfare: someone's health or happiness Nurses are specially trained to provide for their patients' welfare.
