procedure: the normal way of doing something or getting something done

Our health teacher taught us the correct <u>procedure</u> for washing our hands.

prominent: somewhere or something that is easily seen

If you put your car keys in a <u>prominent</u> place, they will be easy to find.

pursue: to work hard in order to achieve something

Jessica's drama coach encouraged her to <u>pursue</u> an acting career.

supplement: something added to something else in order to improve it

Learning new words will help to supplement your vocabulary.
