complicate: to make something more difficult

compromise: to agree to something different than what you originally wanted

facilitate: to make it easier for something to happen

The student council will facilitate a discussion about school safety at the next assembly.

grant: to allow someone to do or have something

Kyle's parents will not grant him permission to buy a car until he can pay for his own insurance.

initiate: to start something

Suzanne will initiate work on her science project to be sure that it is completed on time.

intervene: to try to stop an argument between other people

Mall security was called to intervene in a disagreement between two store owners.

justify: to give a good reason for doing something

The university will need to justify its decision to build a new sports arena.

navigate: to move around

The old warehouse was difficult to navigate because it was filled with boxes.

organize: to put people or things into order

Eva and her sister will organize a graduation party for their older brother.

proceed: to continue; to go in a direction

We will proceed with our plan to go fishing, even if it rains.

terminate: to end

We will not terminate the search for our missing dog until he is found.
