boundary: a line that marks the edge of a surface, space, or area

effort: the physical or mental energy used to do something well

hazard: something dangerous

Strong undercurrents created a <u>hazard</u> for swimmers at the beach.

incident: an individual event that can be unpleasant

The judge instructed the witness to share his version of the incident with the court.

journey: a long trip from one place to another

Our <u>journey</u> to the bottom of the Grand Canyon took three days.

landscape: everything you can see when you look across an area of land

A large number of skyscrapers make up the landscape of New York City.

obstacle: something that stops you from doing something

Watching television can be an <u>obstacle</u> to getting your homework finished.

origin: the beginning of something

Pizza is over a thousand years old; its origin was in Naples, Italy.

penalty: a punishment for doing something that is against a rule or law

The <u>penalty</u> for changing your airline ticket will be fifty dollars.

restriction: a rule or set of laws that limits what you can do, or what can happen

There is a <u>restriction</u> on cell phones at our school; they can only be used during lunch.

structure: something built or constructed

Max and his brother created a large wooden <u>structure</u> to use as a fort.

territory: an area of land

Cattle roam free on the <u>territory</u> surrounding my grandfather's ranch.
