Presidents' Day | February 21st, 2022 | Celebrated annually on the third Monday of February, even though the federal holiday is recognized as Washington's Birthday which is February 22nd. Other Presidents' Birthdays in February are Abraham Lincoln, Ronald Reagan, and William Harrison.

Fun Facts about our Presidents

- 1. George Washington is the only president to be unanimously elected, meaning all state representatives voted for him.
- 2. William Howard Taft weighed 330 pounds. After he became stuck in the bathtub, a larger tub was installed to fit four average-sized men.
- 3. William Taft also served as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court 8 years after leaving the White House.
 - Franklin D. Roosevelt won four elections. He died of a stroke just a few months into his final term. In 1947, Congress passed the 22nd Amendment, which limited future presidents' terms to a maximum of two.
- 5. In 1909, Henry Ford's Model T became the official means of transportation for the White House, thanks to William Taft.
- 6. The first woman to run for president was Victoria Woodhull in 1872 and lost to Ulysses S. Grant.
- 7. Thomas Jefferson disliked public speaking so much he submitted his State of the Union messages to Congress in writing.
- 8. Every president except James K. Polk and Donald Trump have had a pet of some kind while in office. Pets included dogs, horses, parrots (James Madison), tiger cubs (Martin Van Buren), a turkey saved from Thanksgiving dinner (Abraham Lincoln), and a couple alligators (John Quincy Adams and Benjamin Harrison).
- 9. Abraham Lincoln was defeated only once in 300 wrestling matches and won his county's wrestling championship at age 21.

10. John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and James Monroe were three Founding Fathers that later served as presidents died on July 4th. They all played a special role in establishing July 4th as Independence Day.

Burwell Public Schools Receives Federal Emergency Connectivity Fund Grant

Burwell Public Schools recently received a federal grant from the FCC's Emergency Connectivity Fund totalling \$17,573. Ronda Weber, BPS Technology Coordinator, applied for the funds that are earmarked to help schools and libraries provide equipment for remote learning and to close the homework gap for students who do not have adequate access to internet or technology devices.

BPS applied for and received approval to purchase 48 HP Chromebooks for student use, 4 iPads as well as 4 mobile hotspot devices that can be used to provide internet access on buses or in homes where access is not available. This equipment will be instrumental in assuring the success of all students at Burwell Public Schools.
