

1 c. margarine2 tsp. cream of tartar1 ½ c. sugar1 tsp. baking soda2 eggs¼ tsp. salt2 ¾ c. flour4 Tbsp. sugar, 4 tsp. cinnamon, mixedMix above ingredients (except sugar/cinnamon mix) into soft dough. Roll into small balls and roll in
sugar/cinnamon mix. Bake at 400° for 8-10 minutes.


