FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCT 3RD - 9TH, 2021

Since 1922, the NFPA has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in our country. During Fire Prevention Week, children, adults, and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Firefighters provide lifesaving public education in an effort to drastically decrease casualties caused by fires.

Fire Prevention Week is observed each year during the week of October 9th in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and caused devastating damage. This horrific conflagration killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land.



Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety

SMOKE ALARMS • A continued set of three loud beeps—beep, beep, beep—means smoke or fire. Get out, call 9-1-1, and stay out. • A single "chirp" every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be changed. • All smoke alarms must be replaced after 10 years. • Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

CARBON MONOXIDE (CO) ALARMS • A continuous set of four loud beeps—beep, beep, beep, beep, beep, beep—means carbon monoxide is present in your home. Go outside, call 9-1-1 and stay out. • A single chirp every 30 or 60 seconds means the battery is low and must be replaced. • CO alarms also have "end of life" sounds that vary by manufacturer. This means it's time to get a new CO alarm. • Chirping that continues after the battery has been replaced means the alarm is at the end of its life and the unit must be replaced.

Mrs. Dawe's Favorite Recipe

Ham and Cheese Sliders

Directions:

- 1. In a small bowl, mix together mayonnaise and miracle whip. Spread onto both sides of the center of each roll. Place a slice of ham and Swiss Cheese inside each roll. Close rolls and place closely into large baking dish or heavy cookie sheet.
- 2. In a medium bowl, whisk together Poppy Seed Sauce ingredients. Poor evenly over all sandwiches—you don't need to use all of the sauce, just enough to cover the tops. Let sit for 10 minutes or until butter sets slightly. Cover with foil and bake at 350 degrees for 12-15 minutes or until cheese is melted. Uncover and cook for 2 additional minutes or until tops are slightly brown and crispy. Serve warm.

Note: Sandwiches can be assembled ahead of time. I don't like to assemble more than a day ahead of time because they can get soggy from mayo mixture.

- Ingredients:
- 24 white dinner rolls
- 24 pieces honey ham
- 24 small slices Swiss Cheese
- 1/3 cup Mayonnaise
- 1/3 cup Miracle Whip

Poppy Seed Sauce

- 1 T Poppy Seeds (Mrs. Dawe uses 1/2 T.)
- 1 1/2 T Yellow Mustard
- 1/2 cu Butter, melted
- 1 T Minced Onion
- 1/2 tsp Worcestershire Sauce

Counselor's Corner

I continue to make weekly visits to the elementary classrooms to discuss a variety of topics.

In K and 1st grade we have been working on "Good Manners" and using good mannered words and actions.

In grades 2-6 we have spent the majority of October discussing "Be a Buddy, not a Bully". We discussed three important behaviors of a bully: 1. Hurtful behavior (verbal or physical), 2. Actions are on purpose (not an accident), 3 and the behaviors happen more than one time. We also talked about what to do if we are being bullied or if we see bully behavior: 1. Ignore it, 2. Walk away, 3. Tell an adult, 4. Stick up for yourself or someone else. Lastly we discussed the difference between Telling vs Tattling, and Up-stander vs Bystander. Please discuss these topics with your son/daughter and encourage them to tell an adult at school if they see or experience bullying behaviors.

October was Red Ribbon Week. The GLW high school students and Mrs. Smith visited each elementary class room to share the dangers of drugs, alcohol, and bad choices. I will continue these topics with the students in November.

Mrs. Larsen from GLW will be our guest in the 6th grade with a curriculum called "Project Alert" and in the 5th grade with a curriculum called "Too Good for Drugs". Please look for materials coming home with more information.
