Mrs. Archibeque and the 5th and 6th graders completed a group Google slide presentation showing the different aspects of volleyball for Computer/Library class.


Mr. Mann and the 5th and 6th graders have been applying their technology skills to research and present information on the history, rules and famous men's and women's volleyball players.

All these animals are mammals, which means they are warm-blooded and nurse their young.






